Several Oconee Streeter's are also available to meet with families in crisis and offer transportation, diversion and moral support in their time of need. The stories of detention without due process are heart-wrenching; family separation and fear of deportation for families that have lived for years in this community is devastating. MISSIONS BUDGET AND DISBURSEMENTS

The committee has received over 230,000.00 in donations since December 2016. We have committed 135,000.00 so far to local entities: 20K for specialized consulting and promotion of minority entrepreneurs; 80K for no-interest micro-loans for minority owned businesses; 35K for immigration legal services for indigent clients.

Finally, we provided over 2,000.00 in emergency financial assistance to church members and friends last year.
